Interim Report	On October 15 th 2025 you will receive an Interim Report which will include comments on your child's learning and behavior.
Term 1 Report Card	The Term 1 Report Card will be issued on November 14 th , 2025. This report card will cover the period from September 3 rd to November 6 th , 2025, and will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Term 2 Report Card	The Term 2 Report Card will be issued on February 19 th , 2026. This report card will cover the period from November 10 th , 2025, to February 13 th , 2026, and will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Term 3 Report Card	The Term 3 Report Card will be issued on June 26 ^h , 2026. It will cover the period from February 20 th , 2026, to the end of the year and will count for 60% of the final mark for the year. In some subjects, a final exam/evaluation covering the year's learning is administered and weighted at 20% of the third term mark.
